Etiquettes of eating (continued)

- ❖ One should always eat and drink with the **right hand** because Shaytan eats and drinks with the left hand.

- ❖ It is preferable that one uses three fingers while taking meals because the Holy Prophet (SAW) used to do so however it is not compulsory, one may use more than that if there is need.

Science Incursion - Grade 5



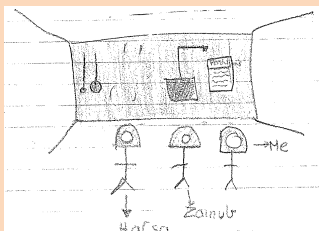

I had a great time doing the experiments and learnt so much from the Incursion.

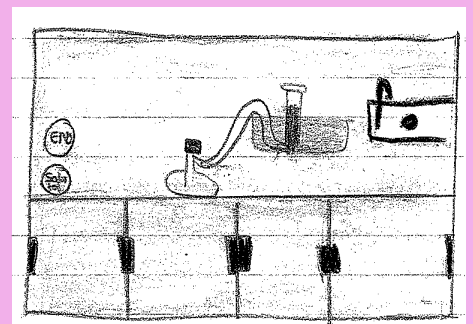
"Incursion Recount" - by Aishah David (5C)

Last week, my class 5C had an incursion in our school Science Lab because we were learning about the scientific methods.

When we arrived at the science lab, a lady was there to meet us, who introduced herself as Kate and she came from a company called CSIRO. Then she explained all about scientific methods and did an experiment with paper planes to show us which plane flew the furthest.

Kate gave us instructions on what to do for the experiments which were laid neatly on the table and then we were put into groups.

Our first group experiment was about measuring the amount of gas that comes from a



powder. We wrote our hypothesis and then started the experiment. We used beakers, straws and many different chemicals to see which powder produced the most gas and compared our results.

We then conducted another experiment with pendulums and discussed our results. I had a really great time and I learned a lot about scientific methods. I am sure that this science incursion will be one I will remember forever and I was sad that it had to come to an end so soon.

CHICKEN POX - Announcement

IMPORTANT!!!

It has come to our attention that some students have been away from school because they have contracted chicken pox.

Chicken pox is a very contagious infection caused by a virus. It is spread from person to person by direct contact or through the air from an infected person's coughing or sneezing. It causes a blister like rash, itching, tiredness and fever lasting an average of 4 to 6 days. Most children recover without any problems. It takes between 10-21 days after contact with an infected person for someone to develop chicken pox.

It is strongly recommended you have your child receive their first or second dose of vaccine. If your child or anyone in your household currently has symptoms that look like chicken pox, contact your regular healthcare provider.

Anyone who has chicken pox should **not attend school** until the blisters become crusted (about 4-6 days after rash appears) or no new lesions appear within a 24-hour period. Keep all chicken pox spots, blisters and other wounds clean and watch for possible signs of infection, including increasing redness, swelling and pain at the wound site.

If your child has contracted chicken pox please make sure they produce a **doctor's certificate** to ensure that the incubation period has lapsed before they attend school.
