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Hadith of the week

[Important] *The honour and respect of the words of Allah (SWT) and His Messenger (SAW) is obligatory on us. Due consideration needs to be given in the manner we dispose such material.*

Salatul Tasbih:

Our Beloved Prophet Mohammed (Sallallahu Alihiwassallam) said to his uncle (father's brother) Sayyiduna Abbass (may Allah be pleased with him): "Oh uncle shall I not give you Shall I not grant you, shall I not do mercy on you. When you do 10 things Allah will forgive your sins: of the future and of the past; new and old; those you have forgotten and those you did knowingly; big and small; hidden and revealed." Then he (SAW) explained and taught the way to pray Salatul Tasbih and then said: "If you can, pray this salah once a day, if you cannot pray once a day then every Friday, and even if this is not possible then once a month and even if this is not possible then once a year and even if this is not possible then at least once in a lifetime."

Etiquettes after eating

- ❖ Imam Tabrani quotes Ka'ab ibn U'jra (RA) as saying : 'I saw Nabi (SAW) eating with three fingers which were the thumb, index and middle finger. Thereafter I saw him licking them in the following sequence: first the middle finger, then the index finger, and lastly the thumb'.(Majma" vol-5)
- ❖ It is improper for one to wipe his fingers with the loaves.
- ❖ One should not get up and leave before he has packed up the sufra.
- ❖ At the time of picking up the sufra the following dua should be recited:

الْحَمْدُ لِلَّهِ حَمْدًا كَثِيرًا طَيِّبًا مُبَارَكًا فِيهِ غَيْرُ مَكْفِيٍّ وَلَا مُرَدِّعٍ وَلَا مُسْتَعْتَبٍ غَمَّةٌ رَبَّنَا

- ❖ Narrated Abu Umama (RA): Whenever the dining sheet of the Prophet (SAW) was taken away (i.e. whenever he finished his meal), he used to say:
"Praise be to Allah Who has satisfied our needs and quenched our thirst. Your favour cannot be compensated or denied." Once he said: "Praise be to You, O our Lord! Your favour cannot be compensated, nor can be left, nor can be dispensed with, O our Lord!"

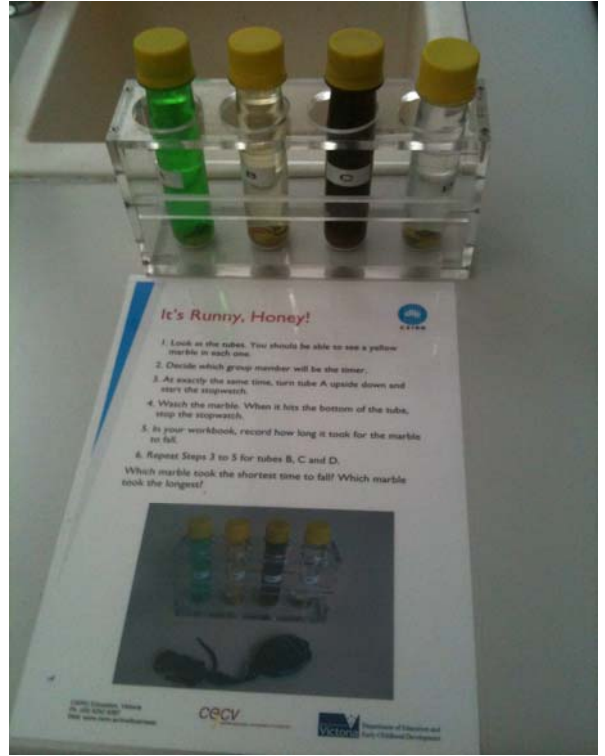
"The poor mums have to walk for 8 kilometres in the heat just to get some flour and oil to feed their children! Imagine having only flour and oil to eat!"

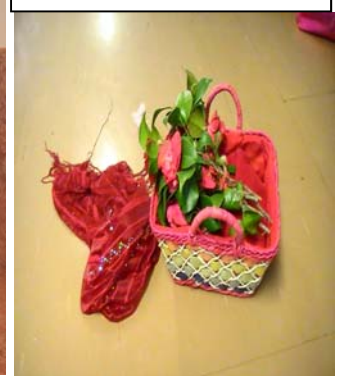
