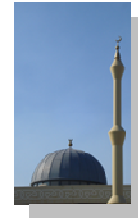

## Principal's address

Monday, 16<sup>th</sup> of February, Secondary students were given an address by the Principal about the importance of having faith and working hard. We will conduct sessions to assist our students to train themselves to improve their good work and study habits.

## Keep Your School Clean Campaign

We are thrilled to introduce a “Keep Your School Clean Campaign” which will encourage students to take responsibility for looking after their environment. We will have incentive programs to ensure the success of this campaign, however if the incentive fail to achieve our targets, we will introduce a fining system. Upon which students will be fined if found littering in the school grounds. The fines will only be

issued by the teacher who has witnessed the incident. The fine is set at \$5.00 per offence.

### Discipline Issues

Although all students made a very positive start, please note the following reminders:

Students who were on Level 2 or beyond in 2008 must sign a 'special contract' at the start of the year. Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the 'special contract' will automatically take them to the level they were at in Term 4, 2008.

Full uniform is expected from all. If children are found to be out of uniform which includes dirty, torn and tattered uniforms, they will be sent home. Parents will be given the option to bring the missing item or purchase it from the school. The uniforms must be in a clean condition, caps and the hijabs must be washed and the shoes must be polished regularly. Students, whose parents are not contactable, will not be allowed in the class rooms and will be supervised separately and costs incurred due to extra supervision will be charged to the parents.

Only plain white scarves that are long enough to cover their shoulders, back and chests are accepted. No makeup or perfume is permitted and Hair must be tied neatly under the cap. Jewellery of any kind is not allowed. Only plain wrist watches are permitted.

Personal hygiene is of utmost importance. Nails should be kept short and clean, teeth must be brushed daily and parents should check the hair of their children regularly for head lice.



Students waiting to be picked up by parents after school must be at the designated areas. No student is permitted to leave his/her designated area to go across the road, outside the gate or to the shops.

### School diaries

Diaries should be brought to school every day and it needs to be taken along to each class. They should also be taken home so that parents can sign them as deemed needed by teachers.

### Items not allowed in school

Money exceeding \$ 5, skateboards, toy guns, expensive toys, radio, electronic games, mobiles, MP3/4 players, video tapes, CDs, USBs and DVDs are not allowed. These will be confiscated and returned to parents of the concerned students at the discretion of the Discipline Committee or Council. USBs are not permitted unless instructed by teachers for research and assignment purposes.

Use of white ink/liquid paper by students is not recommended at primary level since it makes work messy and at times the spills from the tube or bottle leaves marks on their uniform and on the school furniture.

No students are allowed to bring any sharp objects to school.

Students are not recommended to use steel rulers.

Students must not bring any magazines to school that are not part of the school curriculum.
