الْحَمْدُ لِلَّهِ الَّذِي جَعَلَهُ عَذْبًا فَرَاتًا وَلَمْ يَجْعَلْهُ مِلْحًا أُجَاجًا

Translation:

All praise to Allah who has made it palatable, sweet and pleasant to drink and did not make it salty and bitter

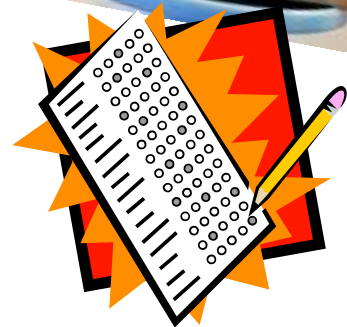
Students are asked to revise daily and go through their test and SAC papers to prepare them for the Exams next week.

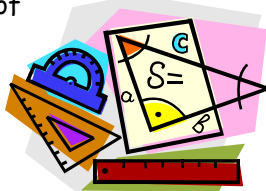
has empowered students to become more knowledgeable individuals.
