


### **5A Students Explore Aboriginal Farming Techniques**



### **Shaping Our World: Year 5's Science Adventure**


Our Year 5 students rolled up their sleeves for a hands-on science adventure with the "Our Changing Earth" incursion. In just 90 minutes, our classroom turned into a mini science lab where students explored how our planet changes over time — and how humans can speed up or slow down those changes.

With help from the fantastic team at Hands On Science, students got to test and see for themselves how weathering and erosion work. They experimented with wind and water to move sand and soil, compared how quickly different soils soak up water, and even tried out methods that mimic the way rocks break down over time.

Along the way, they learned to spot the differences between sedimentary, igneous, and metamorphic rocks — real samples they could touch, hold, and study up close. It wasn't just about rocks, though. Students also looked at how things like farming, mining, and building can reshape landscapes, sometimes for the better and sometimes with big environmental costs.

The best part? Every activity had students predicting what might happen, watching closely to see the results, and then talking about why it happened. Science, curiosity, and teamwork all rolled into one! By the end of the session, our Year 5s had a fresh appreciation for the ground beneath their feet and the role we all play in looking after it.

Through fun activities, students discovered that everyday objects are made from different materials such as wood, metal, plastic, fabric, and glass. They explored how each material feels, using words like stretchy, soft, and rough to describe what they found.

The highlight of the day was when students became "material detectives," sorting and grouping objects based on what they were made from. This sparked lots of curiosity and conversation about why certain materials are chosen for specific purposes.

By the end of the incursion, our youngest scientists walked away with a sharper eye for the world around them — ready to notice and question the materials that make up their everyday lives.

### **Our SEL Journey: Words that Shape Us**

At Darul Ulum Academy, we believe that learning goes beyond books and classrooms — it's also about developing strong character and emotional awareness. That's why our students take part in a special Social Emotional Learning (SEL) program each term.

Every two weeks, a new "Word of the Fortnight" is introduced, with a focus on values that help students grow both socially and emotionally. These words are proudly displayed on classroom posters and homework covers, keeping them front of mind throughout the fortnight.

**Term 1**: Friendship, Self-Awareness, Respect, Confidence, Cooperation

Term 2: Kindness, Empathy, Mindset, Apologise, Forgiveness

Term 3: Gratitude, Decisions, Fairness, Teamwork, Integrity

**Term 4:** Motivation, Self-Discipline, Generosity, Trust/Honesty, Compassion

Teachers bring these words to life through storytelling, classroom discussions and role-playing activities, encouraging students to reflect on what the words mean and how they can apply them in real life.

This program gives students the tools to build positive relationships, manage their emotions, and make thoughtful decisions — skills that will serve them well inside and outside the classroom.



### Standing Strong Together – Anti-Bullying Workshops

Creating a safe and respectful school environment takes teamwork, and that's why students in Years 1–5 participate in termly anti-bullying workshops designed to build awareness, confidence, and resilience.

The workshops focus on two engaging parts:

**Workshop Discussions:** Students learn what bullying is, how to recognize it, and how to respond if they see or experience it. Role-playing and real-life scenarios help bring the school's behavior policy and reporting procedures to life in a meaningful way.

**Game-Based Learning:** Using a fun Kahoot quiz, students test their knowledge through interactive questions about bullying scenarios, safe behaviors, and the importance of speaking up.

At the end of each session, every student proudly receives a certificate of participation, celebrating their commitment to standing against bullying.



### Together We Bloom - Year 4's Kindness Flower

As part of Darul Ulum Academy's ongoing initiative to promote a safe and respectful school environment, an Anti-Bullying workshop was held in Week 3 of this term.

Following the session, the Year 4 girls took part in a special class activity called the Kindness Flower. Each student wrote a message of kindness on a petal, read it aloud to the class, and shared her reflections. The petals were then attached to a stem and "planted" in soil — symbolising how individual acts of kindness, when combined, can grow into something strong, beautiful, and unified.

To conclude the workshop, every student received a certificate of participation, acknowledging their role in this important program and their commitment to fostering kindness and respect in our school.

#### How to Book Your Interview:

- 1. Open your web browser and go to: https://schoolbox.dulum.vic.edu.au/
- 2. Log in using your Schoolbox username and password. (If you have misplaced your login details, please contact reception for assistance.)
- 3. Click on the tile titled Parent Teacher Interview Booking.
- 4. Select the relevant child. (If you have more than one child, you will need to complete a separate booking for each.)
- 5. Choose your preferred times with each teacher from the available slots.

For families with children in the Primary Female Campus: you may book two slots with teachers assigned to two or more subjects.

Once complete, you may print your booking schedule or email it to yourself for convenience.

#### **Important Information:**

Interview slots are available on a first come, first serve basis.

Each interview has been allocated **five minutes** to ensure all parents can meet with their child's teachers.

Where possible, please begin with your child's form teacher (AM rollcall) to collect their report before visiting subject teachers.

Teachers will be located across different classrooms, with their names clearly displayed outside the relevant venue.

If you are a mother wishing to communicate with a male teacher, or a father wishing to communicate with a female teacher regarding your child(ren)'s report(s), you may join the meeting by connecting through your spouse's mobile phone.

We look forward to seeing you at the interviews and working together to support our students' learning journeys.
