## **NAPLAN 2021**

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2021 tests have commenced. They will be held online for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students from Tuesday 11 May to Friday 21 May. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in writing, reading, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Students have been informed of their specific NAPLAN schedule.

Students have also been given an opportunity to become familiar with the question types contained in the NAPLAN Online tests and the functionality of the online platform.

For further familiarisation, students may access the <u>ACARA public demon-</u> <u>stration site</u>.

Later in the year you will receive your child's personal NAPLAN report. The report will describe your child's particular skills in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The report will also show how your child performed in relation to national minimum standards. These describe the minimum acceptable standards for students across Australia.

# Ramadhan Awareness Week

As the month of Ramadan commenced during the Term 1 holidays, students engaged in various activities during Term 1 which related to this holy month. As part of the Tarbiyah Department's ongoing commitment to students' religious education, a "Ramadan Awareness Week" was held with the aim of educating students about the significance of this month and preparing them to undertake the prescribed acts of worship.

With Ramadhan having concluded, we recognise that we have been blessed with the opportunity to observe this holy occasion for yet another year; and we praise our Creator for this favour.

Ramadan is an exciting and fun time, and staff members wish that such excitement and love for the month be felt likewise within the students. Therefore, we would like to take this opportunity to share with you some of the students' work that they have accomplished across the primary year levels as well as what the school did to create a Ramdhan atmosphere.


































## Year 7 and 8 Artwork

Last term, the Year 7 and 8 students learned about the art of the Indigenous culture. Students learnt the different ways Aboriginal people created and displayed their art as well as the different techniques used in their artwork.

Ochre was one of the first pigments to be used by the Aboriginals. Ochre is a natural earth-clay pigment that Aboriginals used in their paintings which was dug or mined from places with a soft colourful stone. It was ground up into a fine powder and mixed with water to create one of the world's first paints. It can range in colour from yellow to deep orange or brown. There are a variety of colours that can be extracted and then mixed with other pigments to produce other colours/hues much like the way acrylic colours are mixed to form other pigments.

There are several types of methods used in making Aboriginal art including rock painting, dot painting, rock engravings, bark painting, carvings, sculptures, weaving and string art. Students focused mainly on the dot painting techniques and learnt that dots were used to fill in designs. They were also used to obscure certain information and associations that lay underneath the dotting.

Throughout the term, students created a dot art painting using a stencil of their hand as the main image. It was inspired by what they had learnt about Indigenous symbols and styles of Aboriginal art. Hand stencils are the earliest and most personal symbols that are seen in Aboriginal rock art sites. They are a primal way of marking territory and their individuality is often emphasised by framing them within a circle and using symbols that represent the clan/camp that the individual belongs to. The hand print is like a signature of the individual who placed it there. Students used their knowledge of Aboriginal symbols and Aboriginal dot painting techniques and created their very own hand stencil art. Below, the Year 7s and 8s have decided to show their mark of territory on the art-room wall by displaying their unique Aboriginal hand-stencil artwork!

So do you want to give the hero award to someone else?


"No, no, your father definitely deserves it! I have to give it to your father. I wish he was my father." [Grade 3C student]




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## **Inspirational Persuasive Writing Pieces by Grade 3 students**
