O My Beloved Muhammad (peace be upon him)

As I travel through my worldly journey in the company of more than seven billion fellow human beings, I long for you by the day.

With all my shortcomings and weaknesses, I am submerged in my daily affairs and the rampant distractions of this world. However, when your blessed name '*Muhammad*' falls upon my ears with the call of every Athaan, I find reason to detach myself from the debris of this world only to realise my soul is gravitating towards you.

As I return from the heavenly journey of prayer to continue with my worldly commitments, I hear some dull and utterly nauseating rhetoric in the background, attempting to scratch the surface of your dignity and honour, but undoubtedly to no avail. It occurs to me that all the manuals of the world cannot teach beauty to an ugly heart.

Nevertheless, I agonise over what strikes my ears, so I run to the papers and publications. I rush to the testimonials and to the books. I search in the commentaries of the Holy Qur'an and its exegesis. What I want is something to extinguish the raging fire within me. I grieve when I come back to my senses realising that the pat of your gentle palm which once upon a time comforted the whining tree trunk that was replaced with your pulpit (*mimbar*) is no longer an option for me. Had I only been the dust on that very tree trunk!

I continue to search, not that I will be able to find you in person as you are resting in your sacred grave, but the rupture of love drives me to at least locate the scent of your blessed soul, the radiance of your beautiful face or the magnanimous bliss of your hands. I finally reach to the verse in which your Lord comforts you and your loved ones when He says: "Only the one who hates you is truly cut off 'from any goodness." (108:3) My heart is cooled and my brain cells are somewhat reshaped. The flames of the slowly subsiding fire are seeking additional elements to calm them down. I stumble across the words of my Lord in which He says: "Surely, We will be sufficient for you against the mockers." (15:95)

I instantaneously inhale the scent emanating from your consoled heart and sprinkle it onto my grieving soul.

O my Beloved, I am still coming to terms with the honour and privilege that have been bestowed upon you by your Lord whereby He made you the gateway and the premise for attracting His mercy and forgiveness when He said: "*If only those 'hypocrites' came to* you after wronging themselves seeking Allah's forgiveness and the Messenger prayed for their forgiveness, they would have certainly found Allah ever Accepting of Repentance, Most Merciful." (4:64)

The remnants of *Huyay ibn Akhtab* and *Kaab ibn Asad* thought that they can perhaps defame your status or graze your honour as a result of the embedded jealousy and malice in their deadly hearts. However, so swiftly did they learn that they were attempting to throw particles of dust on to the glaring sun in the midst of a shinning day.

They question and comment in awe as to why such a reaction from your followers; little did they know that your followers are yet to wake up. Their ignorance and arrogance have obscured them from the noble meaning of true and virtuous love, without which one is nothing but a walking piece of flesh on this earth.

O my Beloved, I cannot help myself but to rehearse these couplets crafted by *Imam Al-Buseeri*:

- What has happened to your eyes, the more you tell them to stop, the more they continue flowing;
- What is the matter with your heart, the more you tell it to come to its senses, the more it is distracted by the love (of my Prophet Muhammad);
- Does the fervent lover think that his love can be concealed while his eyes are shedding tears and his

heart is glowing?!

O my Beloved, unquestionably, you are not in need of my defence nor that of my brothers and sisters. Rather, the dire need of affiliating ourselves with your noble person and character stems from within us as individuals.

It is therefore we recognise that your defence must not be confined to a temporary emotional reaction that evaporates with the passing of days. Instead, the more we acquaint ourselves with the pearls of your blessed biography, the more we learn that genuine defence necessitates a proactive approach in translating your teachings into our practical lives. The price to be paid for reclaiming our honour is the authentic manifestation of your character and practices into our lives.

We know that our future lies in our past and that our history testifies to the fact that when the gems of your teachings surfaced, there was no room for injustice, bigotry nor prejudice to rise, let alone the emergence of an appalling rhetoric that contradicts the basic principles of humanity.

O my Beloved, pardon us for the grave harm that we have inflicted upon ourselves when we belittled your *Sunnah*. We misinterpreted this term by assuming it is 'only' those categorised practices and rituals outlined in the books of jurisprudence. This 'only' is perhaps the precursor for the consequences your *Ummah* is encountering today. We failed to contextualise the true meaning of your *Sunnah* which implies the way of life. That is all walks of life. We have knowingly or unknowingly, attributed *Sunnah* solely to the acts of worship and detached it from the realm of dealings (*Mu'amalaat*) and interactions. Hence the current outcome.

O my Beloved, our shelves may be stacked with weighty volumes of Islamic literature relaying to us the essence of Allah's revelation upon you, unlimited lectures and speeches are at our fingertips, our organisations and institutions are booming in quantity, the voices of Imams delivering their sermons are echoing all the way from Tangier to Tonga, yet I question myself, why the status quo? I guess the missing link is the existence of a society founded on this sacred inquiry: "What would the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) have done in this situation?" Referring to every possible situation, in terms of application and not only in theory. This is the type of society that will flourish and blossom rendering it to the highest levels of salvation and civilisation.

Our current situation is compelling us to marry between our intellect and that of our inner state and conduct. With reference to your teachings and principles, *Ibn 'Ata'illah* has stated: "*Do not keep company with anyone whose inner state does not inspire you and whose speech does not lead you to God."*

As far as the outward appearance is concerned, how often are we engaged in the practice of enjoining good and forbidding evil and how frequently do we discuss the importance of inspiring others by making a positive difference in their lives?! When the conduct of observant individuals who are equally cognisant of theory and practice attracts the mercy and blessings of Allah, such blessings will inevitably impact the entire surrounding and will certainly find their place in the hearts of mankind.

When the 'sincere' opponents are challenged by the prevailing character and mannerisms of Muhammad (peace be upon him) multiplied by 1.7 billion individuals, albeit at varying degrees, not only will the opponents hold back from emitting such repulsive rhetoric, but their hearts will lead them to embrace and advocate authentic beauty and progression.

O my Beloved, I will boycott, I will denounce and I will deplore all forms of aggression and antagonism, irrespective of who identifies with such traits, but above all, I shall strive to reach out to the hardest of all things and that is the reformation of my inner-self.


As I attempt to walk in your footsteps, I observed you through the eyes of my heart because my two eyes were not fortunate enough to glimpse you, I saw you entering Makkah victoriously yet humbly bowing your head, after the excruciating pain and harm that was inflicted upon you and your companions for over a decade. Despite you having the upper hand and the right of command, yet your words and actions were far from being that of revenge or retaliation. You were a profound manifestation of God's will: "*We have sent you* 'O Muhammad' only as a mercy for the whole world". (21:107)



High School Cancer Masterclasses and Competition

This semester the Year 10 students participated in an extracurricular High School Cancer Masterclasses Program. The program was run remotely and fostered a robust understanding of cancer sciences through a relevant and engaging curriculum.

Together with 15 other schools across Victoria, Queensland and NSW, the students participated in 5 master classes conducted fortnightly; where they learnt about the human genome, protein synthesis, the causes, risks, prevention and treatments of cancer and the function of the immune system in combating cancer.

Using their remote learning skills, the students worked collaboratively in cancer project planning and development; and some went on to participate in the Australian High School Cancer Competition. Well done to all the students for extending their interest in cancer and health science beyond the standard high school curriculum and embracing the challenge of applying scientific knowledge in a broader context. 

Below are some examples of exemplary work produced by the primary students. Please enjoy their creativity and efforts.









Seerah Carnival Activities - Secondary


A Seerah Carnival was held during weeks 5 to 8 of Term 4 which coincided with the month of Rabiul Awal. Specific activities were carried out to create an atmosphere and awareness among students about the Seerah of our Prophet (peace be upon him) together with instilling a desire to revive the sunnah of the Prophet (peace be upon him) in our lives as this is our means of success in this world as well as the hereafter.

Various activities were performed across different the year levels by different departments. The focus of the activities was to provide an opportunity for students to express their love and gratitude for the Prophet (peace be upon him). Posters, poems, presentations and *salawaat* (sending salutations and blessings upon the Prophet (peace be upon him)) competitions are some of the activities that were carried out.

During form time after the morning *dua* (prayer) recitation, a compilation of *ahadith* (prophetic traditions) on *akhlaq* (manners and conduct) and salutations and blessings upon the Prophet (peace be upon him) is read out and shared by form teachers at the start of the day followed by weekly discussions by appointed teachers on scenarios in relation to these *ahadith* for students to gauge their implementation of the teachings.





Poem: He was a leader, a leader of Islam
