From Sun to Rain: Year 4s Explore the Water Cycle!

Our Year 4 students have been busy learning all about the fascinating journey of water in the environment — the water cycle! To deepen their understanding, students created a detailed poster with annotations, including a Qur'anic ayah beautifully linking the cycle of rain and water to Allah's creation.

To bring Science into action, the class carried out a hands-on experiment using a plastic bag taped to the window. With the warmth of the sun, students observed water vapour forming inside the bag — just like real evaporation in nature! Over time, they could see how condensation and precipitation occur within this mini water cycle.

This combination of faith, creativity, and practical science helped our students not only visualise but also experience how water continuously moves around our planet.

Working in pairs, they researched different ecosystems — from the icy tundra to the lush rainforest — and designed informative posters about different biomes. It was a fantastic way for students to build foundational knowledge and practice presenting information visually.

Each team explored the unique features of their chosen biome, including:

- · Climate and weather patterns

- · Locations around the world
- · Environmental importance and challenges

Building on this, students then used Wixie to transform their research into digital brochures. Using Wixie's creative tools, students designed brochures that were not only packed with facts but also beautifully illustrated and thoughtfully laid out. Their work demonstrated excellent research skills, digital creativity, and teamwork.

These brochures are now proudly displayed in our classroom and offer a fantastic resource for anyone wanting to learn more about the natural world!

Creativity Unleashed: Year 5's Digital Storytelling Event

This term, our creative Year 5 students took storytelling to the next level! Working in pairs, they planned, wrote, illustrated, and voiced over their very own digital stories using Wixie — a powerful tool for young creators.

From brainstorming imaginative plots to designing vibrant scenes and recording expressive narrations, students collaborated every step of the way. Their stories showcased not only their writing and artistic talents but also their ability to communicate and work as a team.

We were blown away by the creativity, humour, and heart in each project. Whether it was a magical adventure, a mystery to solve, or a tale with a twist, every story was uniquely theirs.

To celebrate their achievements, the Year 5s proudly presented their digital stories in a whole-school showcase event. Students from all grades gathered to watch, listen, and enjoy the imaginative creations — making it a truly special occasion for our entire school community.



DUA Annual Science Fair Sparks Curiosity and Discovery!

Our annual Science Fair was once again a spectacular showcase of creativity, innovation, and a true love of learning! Students across all year levels worked hard to bring science to life through posters, models, experiments, and practical demonstrations, and their enthusiasm lit up the entire school.

Each class contributed something unique:

Habitats on Display – Students explored how animals adapt to their environments by creating model habitats for chickens, penguins, and polar bears. Did you know penguins have a layer of fat and tightly packed feathers to help them survive freezing temperatures, while polar bears have black skin under their fur to absorb heat from the sun? These fun facts brought their projects to life.

Exploring the Solar System – Our young astronomers designed models of the Solar System, showcasing planets in their orbits. A highlight was learning that Jupiter is so massive it could fit more than 1,300 Earths inside it!

What is Science? – Some classes took a step back to brainstorm the very essence of science—asking questions, observing the world, and experimenting. Their colourful mind map reminded us that science begins with curiosity.

Ecosystem Posters – Creative and informative posters explained how different ecosystems—like deserts, rainforests, and oceans—support life. Students highlighted the importance of balance in these environments and how even small changes can have a big impact.

The day was full of action as students demonstrated experiments for their peers and teachers:

Erupting Volcanoes showed how pressure and gases build up beneath the Earth's surface before bursting out.

Rainbow Circles with Primary Dyes illustrated how mixing colours can create endless possibilities, a beautiful nod to chemistry and art combined.

Erosion in Action demonstrated how wind and water gradually shape landscapes, reminding us of the incredible power of nature over time.


DIY Lava Lamps were a hit! Students combined oil, coloured water, and a spoonful of bicarbonate soda before adding vinegar. The fizzing reaction between the vinegar (acid) and the bicarbonate soda (a base) produced carbon dioxide bubbles. As the bubbles rose, they carried colourful droplets of water upward through the oil, creating a dazzling lava-lamp effect. This experiment was a fun and simple way to learn about chemical reactions, density, and gas formation.

The Science Fair wasn't just about projects—it was about learning to ask why and how. Whether it was understanding how ecosystems function, how volcanoes erupt, or how planets orbit the sun, every project inspired awe and wonder.

Well done to our students and teachers for their hard work and creativity in making this year's Science Fair such a success. It was a day filled with excitement, teamwork, and above all, the joy of discovering the world around us.



















Grade 3 Soccer Match – Fun, Friendship, and Team Spirit!





Allergy Awareness and Anaphylaxis Safety


We have several students at our school with allergies and anaphylaxis. To help us keep everyone safe:
